

Definition of interoperability



What is interoperability?




- Interoperability is the capacity of a system to exchange data with another system, without the need for any of them to adapt itself.
- Interoperability is achieved by specifying the interfaces between the systems and which one to use for a particular use case



Scope of interoperability



From ISO/TR 28380:3-2014



- Two dimensional scope of interoperability
 - the need for a "standardized interface" between the infrastructure and the various IT systems and devices it interconnects
 - the end-to-end interoperability requirements (the end-to-end user perception of interoperability)

IHE International

- International initiative sponsored by associations of healthcare professionals around the world
- Joint effort of
 - Volunteer members of associations
 - Healthcare executives
 - Information technology experts
 - Vendor representatives



Goals and achievements of IHE



Main goals

- Facilitate the standard-based exchange of authorized and relevant health information for citizens as consumers
 of health services and for healthcare professionals in the care of their patients.
- Empower patients and health professional with efficient access to necessary health information.
- Make the implementation of healthcare systems easier
- Improve the way computer systems in healthcare share information

How

- Organise itself as a typical Standard Development Organisation
- Address commonly needed specific information exchange related use cases by leveraging widely recognized standards for interoperability
- Bridge the gap between the development of standards and the effective and efficient deployment of standardsbased information exchange in healthcare
- Provide specifications
 - The IHE Technical framework (ISO/TR 28380)
- Testing Tools for conformance and interoperability testing
- Services for interoperability
 - Consultancy
 - Testing events

The IHE is both a process and a forum that rationalizes at a multi-national level the adoption of interoperability standards that can be profiled and combined to meet healthcare needs.



And IHE-Europe?



IHE-Europe: a regional deployment committee


- Non-profit organisation managed by two elected volunteers (two-year term)
 - Vendor co-chair
 - User co-chair
- Engages clinicians, health authorities, industry and users to improve healthcare interoperability by:
 - Helping national and European stakeholders and policy-makers in adopting, promoting and implementing IHE specifications.
 - Developing tools and services in support of interoperability testing.
- Responsible for the organisation of the IHE Connectathon in Europe
 - With support of a national deployment committee
 - Ex. ANS and IHE France this year



IHE Technical Framework



From the user's need to the Technical Framework: A four-step process



The IHE process


- produces detailed implementation guides: the IHE Profiles
- Includes a rigorous testing process for the implementation of these technical frameworks: IHE Connectathons
- Includes a feedback loop for continuous improvement

IHE Connectathon



A place to test interoperability

- IHE Connectathon is part of the IHE technical framework development process:
 - Provides a unique opportunity for vendors to test the interoperability of their products in a structured environment with peer vendors.
 - Author can receive quick feedback on their specifications
- Participants test against multiple vendors using real-world clinical scenarios following specifications from IHE Profiles.
- Tests are overseen by a team of volunteers: the monitors
- Results are published by IHE International



Key benefits of the IHE Connectathon



- For IHE and SDOs
 - Collect feedback on the IHE specifications
 - Clarify some areas upon request
- For Monitors
 - Education
 - Network
- For test tool developers
 - Collect feedback
 - Fix bugs
 - → Great initiative and great chance to improve healthcare

Role of the monitors



- Provide support to participants when they have questions about an IHE Profile
 - You might not have the answer and you will be teached who to contact if you need support
- Review the evidences posted by the participants and decide whether the test run is successfully or not
- Remain neutral and try to solve conflict if any





- Before the event starts
 - Attend the webinars to be familiar with the test tools
 - Review the IHE profiles and the test cases
- During the event
 - Monitors will be assigned a list of test cases to verify;
 - When test runs for one of this test cases are ready to be verify, they will pop-up in the monitor's worklist;
 - Monitors claim test runs and review the evidences based on the « Evaluation » section of the test case
 - Monitor grade the test: Verified (all criteria are met), Failed



Main benefits



- Interact and establish a relationship with the engineers who develop the healthcare products
- See how interoperability and IHE Profiles work in practice
 - You will have access to the vendors and they can demonstrate how their systems work
 - See how different vendors are implementing technical solutions
 - See how different vendors are tackling the same technical problem
 - See more integration in one week than in 10 years in a normal clinical environment
- Learn about IHE Profiles and the underlying standards
 - Get back valuable experience of how to leverage IHE in your own clinical environment
 - How can you drive the adoption of IHE in your organisation
- Finally, that's a unique chance to make an impact on our healthcare industry
- Note: first time monitors are paired with a returning monitor, for training purpose, during the first days








2023 IHE Connectathon - Timeline





What's next?



- End of May:
 - List of testable profiles is created and the number of systems under test for each is known
 - IHE Connectathon management team assesses how many monitors are necessary for each profile
 - Select the monitors
- Early June
 - Monitors are informed about the status of their application
- From June to September
 - Webinars (How to in Gazelle)
 - IHE Connectathon management team assign tests to monitors
 - Training resources made available
 - Self-training (as time permits):
 - Read the IHE Profiles
 - Read Connectathon test cases

Selection criteria



As defined by IHE-Europe T²S committee

- The applicant shall not work for a company that attends (or has attended) an IHE Connectathon as vendor
- Field and level of expertise in the "testable profiles"
- Number of companies from the country of origin of the monitors
 - We try to keep a consistent ratio between the number of companies and the number of monitors from a given country
- No more than 3 persons from the same company to allow the dissemination of IHE
- The monitor shall not have conflict of interest and shall accept the NDA
- How the travel and the accommodation are funded will also be taken into account. IHE-Europe might refuse to pay air fares for travellers outside Europe.
- To allow dissemination of IHE, new monitors are more than welcome, they might represent between 15% and 20% of the team.







- GASQ will hold an on-site exam in Rennes, during the IHE Connectathon week
- IHE-Europe offers the monitors to take it for free
